

Neighborhood Watch

BHNA will be adding a regular Neighborhood Watch/ Security feature to each meeting during 2007. APD Officer Cody Weiser, District Representative of the Southwest Area Command, will be joining us to talk about APD activity in the Barton Hills area. Officer Cody will discuss specific traffic enforcement and security issues. He will also respond to questions from the membership concerning safety/security matters. We are very appreciative of the willingness of APD to work closely with our association over the next year.

The BHNA Neighborhood Watch has been active for several years now and the volunteer list continues to grow. These volunteers take notice of suspicious vehicles, keep an eye on neighbor's homes and property, report vandalism, note street or utility repair needs and in general, assist in maintaining the security of this fantastic neighborhood. They provide the extra eyes and ears that support successful law enforcement in our area. The resident volunteers of a particular block know their neighbors, know the cars and individuals that live on the block and can identify and suspicious activity enforcement. In short, they make it very risky for someone to engage in criminal activity without being seen.

Remember, the Neighborhood Watch serves as the eyes and ears of a neighborhood, they do not serve as the arm. Volunteers are reminded that their duty is to report only. Call 911 and report your concerns, law enforcement will do the rest.

Work Day Report

Our last work day of 2006 was on October 28, and we did some work on both the Homedale and Gus Fruh trails. Our stalwart core "team of seven" continued work on the large boulder retaining wall by the Gus Fruh swimming hole. It is a creative and ambitious project that will probably require a few more work days to complete.

Our Homedale trail got some much-needed attention. The overgrown trail entry area was mowed and cleared of invading vines and ragweed and lamb's quarters. We the persistent hacked back returning Ligustrum and Chinaberry in the midst of our growing native tree grove. And the hunt for intrusive Nandina and Ligustrum along the switchback trail continued, using the weed wrenches to uproot them. The trail was smoothed and cleared of stray rocks and drainage channels were refurbished.

It was perfect weather for collecting seeds and replanting them in open areas, and we had a great group of girls from the Austin Girl's School who were just right for the job. A sizeable group of younger children and their parents ranged far and wide collecting trash from the creek and cleaning graffiti from the boulders. Our strong and hardy Travis County Juvenile Partners gathered and stockpiled stones for future trail edging projects and helped with some of the clearing work.

In all, we had 47 people working on the two trails, contributing 219 hours of labor for the good of our greenbelt. The before and after difference was notable.



Year Summary

Barton Creek Greenbelt is widely appreciated, and we continue to attract new volunteers to our stable core neighborhood volunteers. This past year we reached a new record of 664 volunteer hours, which at the City's \$10.65/hour volunteer rate, yields a contribution of \$7,071.65 from the BHNA Greenbelt Guardians to the Parks Department.

Much more importantly, there are visible improvements along our adopted trails, and a growing community of active "boots on the ground" advocates for the greenbelt.

During the year we expanded our program. In August, we entered into a fiduciary umbrella agreement with the Austin Parks Foundation in order to qualify us as a 501 (c) (3) organization capable of accepting donations and receiving grants. In October we joined the Keep Austin Beautiful "Adopta-Creek" program, which provides support in terms of volunteer recruitment and great trash pick-up tools and watershed protection advice. We already met all of their criteria for membership.

October and November were "harvesting" months for us. The Greenbelt Guardians were recognized at the 2006 PARD/Adopt-A-Park Awards Ceremony as the "Neighborhood Association of the Year". We received a beautiful carved remnant piece of the Treaty Oak with an inscription. We were also recognized by the Save Barton Creek Association at their annual awards ceremony in November, with a plaque of appreciation for our work in the ecological restoration of the Barton Creek greenbelt. It is extremely rewarding to be acknowledged by these two groups that play such an important role in managing and protecting this wild green space that we have adopted.

We have already begun our plans for 2007, which includes a collaboration with the Austin Parks Foundation and the Parks Planning Department to plan increased volunteer activities and resources in other areas along the greenbelt trail needing attention. Our goal is to get the other four miles of the trail adopted and tended on an ongoing basis.

Committee on Area Development

Committee on Area Development Formed

Due to membership interest and concern over the increasing development and zoning issues in the areas surrounding Barton Hills, the Executive Committee has established a committee to monitor these activities and to report to the Executive Committee monthly. The Committee on Area Development will be chaired by BHNA member and former president, Peter Hess. The committee will be comprised of BHNA members with expertise in city government, planning, zoning and development. They will keep the Executive Committee apprised of development/zoning related matters and make suggestions to the Executive Committee concerning the need for possible immediate responses to the issues having a direct effect on the quality of life in our neighborhood. The committee will also provide regular briefings to the membership as part of every BHNA meeting during 2007. The committee will use the listserve to keep members informed between meetings. The general membership will then have the opportunity to discuss the issues and determine if Association action or response is necessary.

Most of the development and zoning activities now occurring around Barton Hills are outside our immediate association physical boundaries, but they will have an impact on the quality of life in our neighborhood. Traffic, utilities, city services, parks and more may well be affected as a result of the decisions made by the city. We, as a neighborhood need to be well informed on these and any other area matters that could impact our neighborhood. The Committee on Area Development will meet this need.
